When we wrote this email we are in the process of completing this. A lot is yet done, however a lot is still to be done. What is 'handy' and how do you handle items that are not available in Cambodia? We were, for example, looking for a 'box' for Amy. Then we were told that they do not use such a thing. Babies are carried by the mother all the time (not when they sleep;-)). We try to adapt as much as possible to the locals but we need discernment to decide when do you adapt and when not. We pray for wisdom in this matter.

We did start with some language study last friday. Call it a 'survival-course' into Khmer. Rotha, a Christian lady who lives close by, is our language helper. We are very thankful for her help! At first we are working on numbers (not the 4th book;-)), and some short sentences. This should allow us to be a little more selfsupporting in every-day issues. We are looking into the rest of the

language learning now. Recently we heard that some mission agencies will start a language school later in the year. We might be able to join that school. This might have the extra opportunity to connect to other missionaries. Do you pray along for the right choices in this whole process?

Okay, and what about us? To be honest we do have guite a hard time here. One day we think: 'Okay, we do need to adjust but this will be allright', the other day we think: 'How will we ever be able to do this ...?'. With our minds we know that this is normal and part of the process, but that does not make it feel more 'relaxed'. We do need to adjust to the rhythm of life here, all the noise. We live in a busy street and recognise now that our place in Holland was (very) quiet and nice. We also face culture differences, things that we do not understand yet. Nothing wrong with that of course, it's just different, but that's what it is; it's all so different... Some things sees so enological and inefficient to us;-)

Joy and Micha are doing very well and they enjoy the time here! They seem to have little problem with the heat and do play a lot. That is mostly done inside the house because we do not know were to go with them yet. Amy is also doing fine. She seems to have a otitis. We all do cough a lot these days. We think that it is because of the dust and the fact that we are not used to that. Thank God that we all did not get sick until now and that we can use our energy to adjust to Cambodian living.

Of course we do also enjoy the time here. We do enjoy the 'tuk-tuk', all the different sorts of fruits and vegetables, each other and the fact that our house becomes more and more our home. We do have fun and got scary when dead chicken eyes look to us from the bag after Talitha comes back from the market...

We do also enjoy the Bible very much, it comes alive in a new and fresh way. Together we read the Psalms and we experience that the Lord uses these to speak to our hearts. We feel like David who, when he was needy, called unto the Lord and we also experience the voice of the Lord when He comforts us.

We did share some prayer topics above, but here are some more:
