'ROOTS':

On a Sunday morning we start early with breakfast because at 8 o'clock the kids club from the local church will start at the Roots ground nearby. The children can go there by their own because the club is at walking distance. Together with a group of about 10-20 children from the neighbourhood they listen to a bible story, make a handcraft and play games together.

After that, after a cup of coffee, we will make a trip as a family like a walk in the national park, having a pick nick near the water etc.. The young church we visit in the afternoon exists mainly out of a group

of children and a small but enthusiastic group of adults. Slowly we learn to know them better and we are grateful for this new place.

SHALOM VALLEY UPDATE

We are nearly ready to start building. We found a contractor who can build the first building for us. Depending on the incoming funds we hope to be able to proceed with building step by step.

Also the groundwork goes on. The road has been prepared again to endure the heavy loaded trucks that will deliver materials the coming time. There are still enough challenges to deal with. But we keep optimistic, heading for the final goal. Together with the team in Phnom Penh we look forward to the first camp in Shalom Valley.

Mart-Jan works mainly (at the moment) at home. Luckily we have access to a good mobile internet connection. He also travels regularly to and from Phnom Penh because of meetings and/or meetings with the contractor.

Talitha works also from the home and coaches new coordinators who follow an online training(watch introduction video <u>here</u>)

FAMILY UPDATE

We enjoy our new place. The peace, the green, the wideness, the first contacts with the people around us. We do notice we are still in transition and have to invite all kind of thins because everything and everyone is new. It's part of the process. But it is intensive.

The children also are trying to find their balance between school and free time. Micha would desire to lock up some of his schoolbooks until the end of the school-year! For suddenly there's a sea of space outside the house to run, climb, scramble, cycle, dance and jump the whole day. And a lot of children with whom they can play! They enjoy it to the max. It's a great blessing! They manage well in the local language, the Khmer, combined with the use of hand and feet when necessary. Sometimes children from the neighbourhood come to play with the Lego and Joy and Micha will look after their cows.:-)

Amy misses Sak ('ming') the most, but at the other hand her world suddenly has broadened. That helps her. It's a feast to explore so many new things and people. Who will get a little chicken hatchling as a visitor every day? We call him "Harm": "Nice to neet you@".

The hot season has started, but to us it is bearable compared to the temperature in Phnom Penh! The sea wind is nice. Of course it is sometimes really too hot, but we notice now that we are more accustomed to it.

We were preparing the house in advance of the raining season that will come, when early this week unexpected a very early rainstorm started which resulted in a total wet ground floor. We don't know yet if this is 'normal' or just a bit exceptional.

HOME-SCHOOLING

Every morning from about 8.00 to 12.00 Joy and Micha get homeschooling. They are used to this rhythm and the neighbourhood children too by now, and it goes well. They enjoy, roughly, the new challenges. They started to build a fort in the backyard.

Early Wednesday mornings we go for a swim together. The children get swimming lessons and we all enjoy this break in the week. Four afternoons a week the children have , together with a group of local children an hour Khmer lesson. They learn to read and write.

For the coming school-year (2017-2018) we are considering to ask a teacher from the Netherlands to teach our children. Are you, or do you know someone who would be interested in this, be free to send us an <u>email</u>!

We are happy to know that we also in the coming time will be carried by your prayers and care!
