Trip to Cambodia

Those of you who receive our prayer-letter as well as our newsletter know that we decided to quite with OMF. We have seen that, through time, we disagree too much to continue. This disagreements has mainly to do with the way we see 'faith'-mission. We've seen that we have a different concept on this subject. We have had a good meeting about it and have said 'good-bye', and prayed together about it. We are happy and thankful for this way of quitting it.

The consequence of this choice was that we were without an organization and had to re-think and re-pray how to go to Cambodia.

While quitting with OMF we came across three different other options to go to Cambodia. We didn't look for them at that moment but they just 'came'. We have looked and prayed into these options and from the three there is one option that connects to us most.

This option is a network that is active in south-east-Asia (for example in Cambodia) and that is aiming to bring people to Christ and see churches being planted. They have offered to help us with coming to Cambodia, living there, make first contacts, VISA, language learning, and joining in the (church) projects they already have. We can choose to continue to work with them, but we're also free to do whatever we think that we should be doing at that time. This option seems to fit very well in

terms of vision, way of working, and the way it is organized.

I (Mart-Jan) hope to go to Cambodia from the 14th until the 22th of October. I hope to go with an experienced missionary worker to meet the team there, visit the projects and go through some practical issues. It is a wonderful option for us to meet them and also for them to meet us! A life meeting is still much better than all the modern media we have nowadays. Talitha will stay in Holland to take care of the kids. It seemed good to us to give them some stability and rest after all the changes we have been into last weeks.

We are very much looking forward to this trip. We are excited about the things to come and are looking for the final 'go', or 'no-go'.

For us this whole process is a enormous challenge. Especially now, when things become more concrete, we feel the weight and consequences of the choice to go into mission. We know, however, that it is not us who do it, and that we can depend on the Lord fully. That's enough!

We want to thank you very much for all your prayers, gifts and support. We value this part of team-work.
